Introduction

This bibliography presents, in chronological order, all items published in the journal *ROLSI*, from 1987 to 2022 (exc. editor comments). The list makes it easier to view the journal's contents at a glance, or to track and find specific items, authors, analytic interests and phenomena, settings and situations, data languages, etc. The list begins in 1987, when the journal changed its name and orientation, after starting in 1969 as *Papers in Linguistics*. I compiled the bibliography from pages at the publisher's website (*Taylor & Francis*) at <https://www.tandfonline.com/toc/hrls20/current>.

In earlier versions I corrected some errors in the website records, such as spelling/order of contributor names, or incorrect and lost typographical detail, I removed excess information, and I reformatted and tidied details for consistency. My aim was to ensure that entries here matched the content and formatting of the actual published papers, although I used consistent capitalisation across the list. I also more clearly indicated some Special issues and sections, and featured debates and articles. Sometimes the title of the issue/section was not clearly stated, so I determined this from the guest editor introduction paper. Otherwise, I mostly used the publisher's website headings. **For this version**, I have not checked details against each individual paper, but instead have relied on the web pages for each issue, and the journal's capitalisations.

I originally prepared the bibliography for a review study of *ROLSI* papers:
